LESSON

Ladies and gentlemen, this is Maria Saito and I'm your **chief flight attendant**. On behalf of **Captain** Takeo Maeda and the entire crew, welcome aboard Japan Airlines flight 073, **non-stop** service from Tokyo to Los Angeles. Our **flight time** will be 9 hours and 50 minutes. We will be flying at an **altitude** of 10,600 meters at a **ground speed** of 800 kilometers per hour.

Now we request your full attention as the flight attendants demonstrate the **safety features** of this aircraft.

- When the **seat belt sign illuminates**, you must **fasten** your seat belt.
- There are several **emergency exits** on this aircraft. Please take a few moments now to locate your nearest exit.
- In the event of a **decompression**, an **oxygen mask** will automatically appear in front of you. If you are travelling with a child or someone who requires assistance, secure your mask on first, and then assist the other person.
- In the event of an **emergency**, please assume the **bracing position**. Lean forward with your hands on top of your head and your elbows against your thighs. **Ensure** your feet are flat on the floor.
- A **life vest** is located in a pouch under your seat or between the armrests. To inflate the vest, pull firmly on the red cord, only when leaving the aircraft. If you need to refill the vest, blow into the mouthpieces. Use the whistle and light to attract attention.

You will find this and all the other safety information in the card located in the **seat pocket** in front of you. We strongly suggest you read it before take-off. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to ask one of our crew members. We wish you all an enjoyable flight.
