
Lesson 4: There is/are ~ When ~ If ~



There is - There are

- To say that something exists (or doesn't exist).

We use "there is" for singular and "there are" for plural.



- There is one department on the 12th floor.
- There are three departments on the 15th floor.



Man: It's almost noon. I'm hungry.

Woman: There is a good restaurant near the office.

Man: Shall we go there?

Woman: Yes, let's go and eat there.

USE OF 'WHEN'



We use when as a conjunction meaning 'at the time that'.



a word which connects two words or clauses or sentences and shows the relation between them.



Ms. Smith: Hey, Kate. There's a package delivered here at the office. I received it on your behalf since you didn't respond when I called.

Kate: Sorry, Ms. Smith. I was still sleeping when you called.

Ms. Smith: It's all right. You can get it here later.

USE OF 'IF'



We use if to introduce a possible or unreal situation or condition.

We use when to refer to the time of a future situation or condition that we are

certain of.

• You can only go in if you've got your ticket.

• When I'm older, I'd love to travel the whole world!

Yuki: Oh that's nice!
