



Grammar

Pattern: We usually <u>call</u> her <u>Mari</u>.



Liz, Elizabeth James

That's Elizabeth James. We usually call her Liz.



Bernie, Bernard Park

That's Bernard. We usually call him Bernie.

We usually call him/her ____.

In talking about someone's nickname, you can use the phrase "We usually call him/her + the nickname of the person.

For example: Sakura Kondo, Saku-chan

That's Sakura Kondo. We usually call her Saku-chan.

This phrase will help you talk about how something makes you feel.

Singular subject + makes me + adjective

Badminton makes me happy.

Plural subject + make me +
adjective

His songs make me relaxed.

Grammar

Pattern: I don't remember when it starts.



Q: When did the meeting start?

A: I don't know <u>when it</u> started.



Q: Where was Jane this afternoon?
A: I don't know where Jane was this afteroon.

Answering 'I don't know' to WH questions

Q: What time is she picking us up? A: I don't know what time she is picking us up.

I don't know + <u>WH question</u> + doer of action + action

I don't know what time she is picking us up.

Remember to keep the verb tense consistent.
